Why We Do What We Do

Girls who are 4 to 21 years old are especially vulnerable. That is why we focus on them. Our girls are given not only an academic education, but moral and spiritual education as well. We are forming intelligent, self-confident, and inspiring young women ready to meet life's challenges and opportunities.

Our challenge: 1 in 9 children in India (52 million) live in extreme poverty, often forced to work and prevented from going to school.

Our impact: Girls who finish secondary school – with our help – are TWICE as likely to escape poverty than girls who are unable to receive an education.




Our Founder's Story

In 2006, Paul Wilkes and his wife visited a poor orphanage in Kochi, India. Among the 70 girls they met was Reena. All the girls had suffered from abandonment, abuse, malnutrition – but Reena's story profoundly moved Paul.

Reena had been begging on the streets and was kidnapped. Her captors held her down and plunged a darning needle in her eye to make her a "better" and more profitable beggar.

Paul gasped, a look of horror on his face at this unspeakable cruelty. Reena looked up at him with the most beautiful, trusting smile he had ever seen in his life. He vowed to help create a better life for Reena and her friends, and Homes of Hope India was born that day.
